

Downloading a GEDCOM File from your Family Tree on Ancestry.co.uk or Ancestry.com

You will need to be logged into your account on Ancestry.




You now have on screen the place where you may manage different aspects of your tree such as who you share it with, site preferences and the facility to export your tree as a gedcom file.
