Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of 18 May 2026.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children. The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family. Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

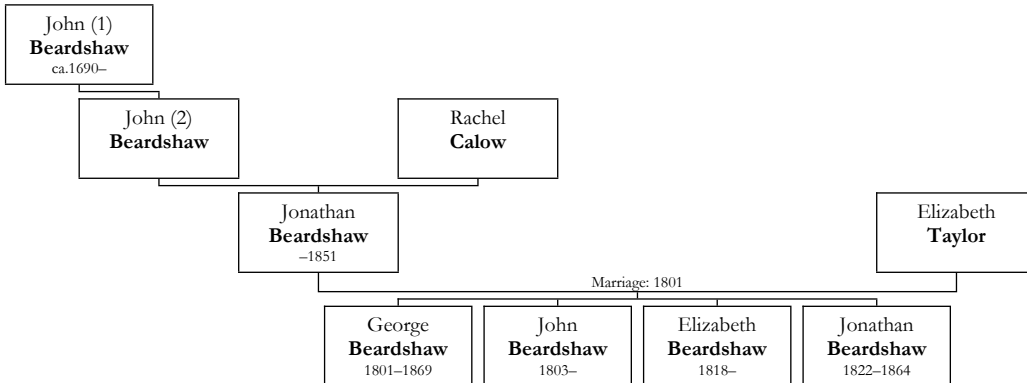
In the chapter titled "Family of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Jonathan Beardshaw are presented in a kind of enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose relatives are listed in the later chapters.

The chapter titled "Families of his Ancestors" provides details (as known as of the publication date) for the relatives of Jonathan Beardshaw. There is a chapter for each generation. Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

This document reports the details of 125 individuals, of whom 61 are male and 62 are female. The sex of 2 individuals is unknown. Of the 36 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 61.8 years. Of these, 21 males averaged 62.8 years, and 15 females averaged 60.3 years. The longest living male was Sydney John Beardshaw (1889–1979), who died aged 90. The longest living female was Elizabeth Sarah Mary Wood (1885–1974), who died aged 88.

1. **Jonathan Beardshaw.** He was the son of John (2) Beardshaw (3) and Rachel Calow (4). Jonathan was baptised in Sheffield, Yorkshire., on 27 March 1780. Address: St Peter & St Paul (Sheffield Cathedral). He worked as a Silver Plater in Sheffield between 26 March 1802 and 4 December 1803. Jonathan worked as a Cutler and Landlord of the Ball Inn in Ball Inn, Hawley Croft, between 1803 and 1820. He worked as a Saw Manufacturer in Sheffield, Yorkshire., in 1841. Jonathan worked as a Founder of J Beardshaw & Son Ltd - Baltic Steel Works. notes. He died in Sheffield on 16 March 1851. Jonathan was buried in St Peter & St Paul (Sheffield Cathedral) on 20 March 1851.

Jonathan Beardshaw features in a book in which it is claimed he fathered 28 children!

Born 1780 died 1851. Continued the Hollis Croft works and also took the Ball Inn, Hawley Croft. Both he and his brother John were licensed victuallers.

Set up his eldest son George in the saw trade at age of 21 and entered partnership with him in 1819. [this would indicate George must have been born in or born before 1798 but of course it could be wrong]

The text states that Jonathan was also landlord of the 'Ball Inn' as well as running 'Hollis Croft Cutlery works'

States that only the 1st and 28th child lived.

The following entry appears in the 'Deaths' section of the 'Sheffield Independent' newspaper Saturday 22 March 1851

"Beardshaw.- On Sunday last, in his 72nd year, highly esteemed by a large circle of friends, Mr Jonathan Beardshaw of the firm J. Beardshaw & Sons, saw manufacturer, Garden Street."

Date of death is therefore 16-3-1851

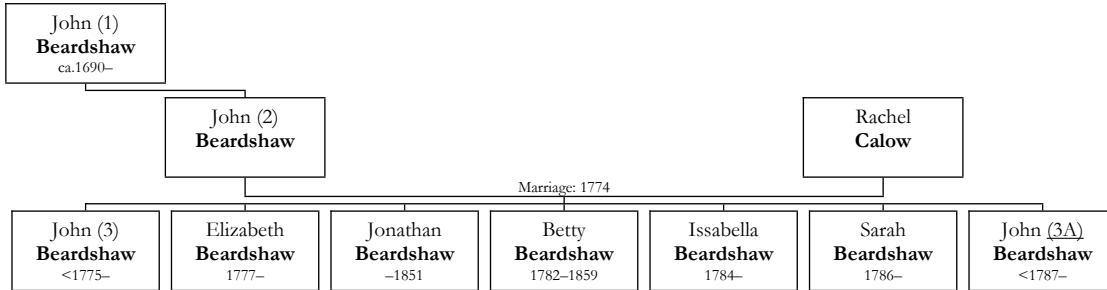

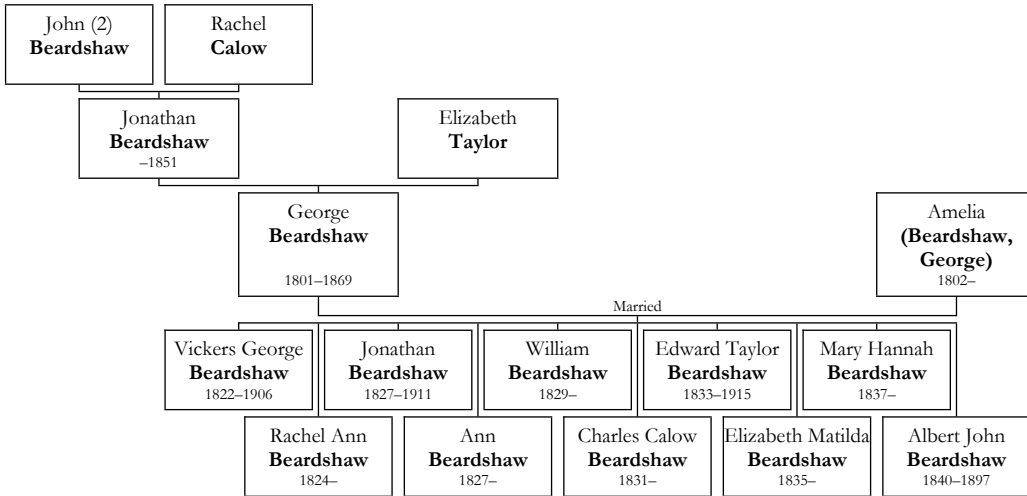

George was baptised in St Peter & St Paul (Sheffield Cathedral) on 26 March 1802. He worked as a Saw Maker in Sheffield, Yorkshire., in 1822. George worked as a File and Saw Manufacturer in Sheffield between 1841 and 1851. He worked as a Merchant between 1844 and 1852. He worked as a Gentleman in Sheffield, Yorkshire., on 17 November 1866. George worked as an Alderman and Proprietor of the Baltic Works.

George died on 28 March 1869, at the age of 68.

As far as it can be made out George was the first child of Jonathan Beardshaw described in the Sheffield Mercury note below. George went on to run the family business after Jonathan died and it was he who organised the building of the Baltic Steel Works that is still standing in the 21st century on Effingham Road in the Attercliffe area of Sheffield. George was highly respected person and he went on to be an alderman of the city.

There is an entry in 'History of the Company of Cutlers in Hallamshire in the County of York' under the heading:

'List of Apprentices and Freemen'

Beardshaw, George, Purchase 'filesmith' Freedom of Sheffield in 1860

Sheffield Mercury 10 August 1822

Entry in Sheffield Mercury 10 August 1822. Although the name is not mentioned other evidence indicates the following entry relates to JONATHAN BEARDSHAW of the Ball Inn - Hawley Croft (See Reminiscences of Sheffield

"Yesterday afternoon, a respectable couple, inhabitants of this town, presented their EIGHTH AND TWENTIETH CHILD at the baptismal font of the Parish Church. They have been married about 20 years, and the mother has been delivered of a child every succeeding ten months. A very respectable surgeon in this town can bear testimony to this fact, having himself

attended her at every birth except one, and on this occasion he happened to be away from home. There have been no twins, and the eldest and youngest are the only children now living."

So George was born around 1802/3 and Jonathan in 1822

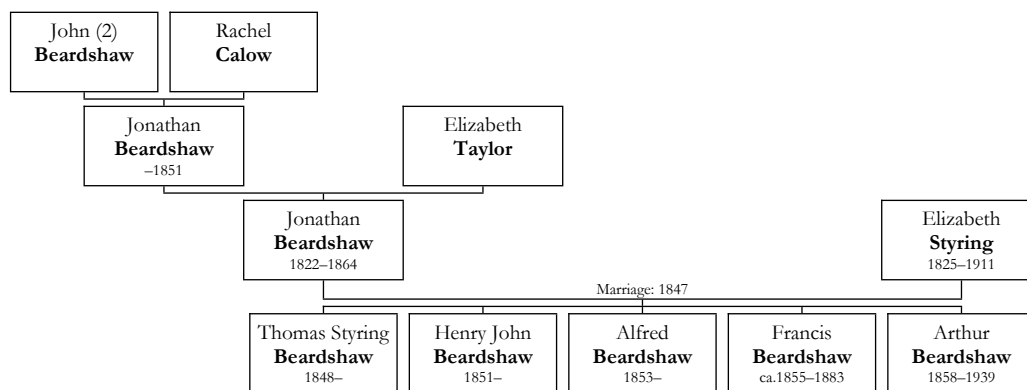

...and the twenty-eighth, destined to carry on the ancestral business at Diamond Works, Hollis Croft, and to have as his son Mr. Henry John Beardshaw who still lives in his father's house at the corner of Northumberland Road and Western Bank ("Western Hill," formerly called - The Racecourse Nook Crookesmoor~), and continues the manufacture of cutlery in Hollis Croft.

The following entry appears in the 'Deaths' section of the 'Sheffield Independent' newspaper 1st July 1864: "Beardshaw.- June 30th, of apoplexy, aged 42, greatly respected, Mr Jonathan Beardshaw, of Mushroom bank, brother of Mr. Alderman Beardshaw, of Attercliffe"

10. At the age of 24, Jonathan married **Elizabeth Styring** on Wednesday, 10 February 1847, in All Saints, Rotherham, when she was 21 years old. They had five sons.

Elizabeth was born in Rotherham on Thursday, 17 February 1825. She reached 86 years of age and died in 27 Northumberland Road on 31 December 1911.

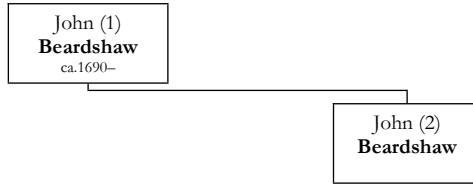

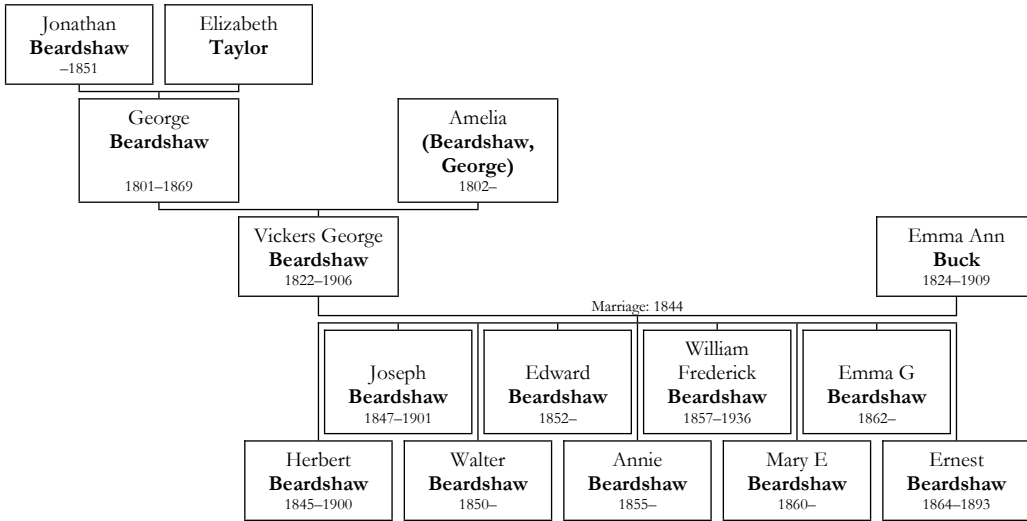

Vickers George worked as a Merchant on 2 August 1844. He worked as a Saw Maker on 3 March 1847. Vickers George worked as a Proprieter of the Baltic Works (see notes) in Effingham Road, Attercliffe, Sheffield, Yorkshire.

He retired on 4 April 1893. Vickers George died in Kent on 22 April 1906, at the age of 83. He was buried in St Margaret at Cliffe, St Margaret, Kent, on 27 April 1906.

Historical Brief by Simon Barley, UK

The following article was found on the website of Tim Pearson. it should be noted that this was written by a non-family member and it is from a business perspective rather than a family perspective, therefore it's genealogical accuracy should be not taken as litteral.

Historical Brief by Simon Barley, UK

Beardshaw is a common Sheffield surname, and the trade and training of the first Jonathan are therefore uncertain.

In 1789-90 a John Beardshaw was dealing with the firm of George Tucker and Co, whose ledger of the period is in the Sheffield Archives ; his address was White Croft, but an even closer connection is probably the Jonathan Beardshaw who is listed in the 1787 directory as a victualler in Hollis [sic] Croft, a parallel street only yards away; the directory for 1817 shows Jonathan Beardshaw as a victualler, i.e. keeper of the Ball public house, in Hawley Croft, again a street in the same area.

Hollis Croft was the address of the sawmaker John Harrison, an early entrant to the trade whose name disappears from the directories in 1817 with the death of his son Thomas. Some of the first entries in the Beardshaw ledger, which starts in 1823, show purchases of sawmaking tools and stock; these entries are not the very first, however, and it is not clear from this document where Beardshaw came by the tools to begin: were they perhaps from the defunct Harrison works, or elsewhere?

He could actually have started with almost nothing more than a single room, Sheffield industry being so structured that everything could have been hired in some form or other, from skilled labor to tools, materials and production facilities; owning one's own was probably more economical, however, hence the purchases noted.

The opening entries in the Beardshaw ledger date from 1823, and show sales of saws to prominent Sheffield firms like William Marples and Naylor Sanderson: from its first days it was integrating with local industry, but no doubt a newcomer would have had few selling options, and would have had to use local firms which combined manufacture with merchandising the products of others. To have a traveler who was either a partner or perhaps an employee was something that would have had to wait until a degree of prosperity was assured. However, the binding of an apprentice at the same time, and the immediate inclusion of Beardshaw's son in the firm may be taken as additional indications that the victualler was by then already feeling confident that he had a future in sawmaking.

Nevertheless, Beardshaw still chose to appear as a victualler at the Ball a full five years later, in the 1828 directory, where his entry is "*Victualler and sawmaker*" [italics added].

By 1833 the firm called itself "Jonathan Beardshaw and Son, saw, steel busk and doctor manufacturers and cutlery dealers". A George Beardshaw (Jonathan's son?), "saw manufacturer", is listed living in a nearby street, and a William Beardshaw (another relative?) is in Garden street as a maker of stag, buck and horn knife hafts. There was such an enormous amount of cutlery making in Sheffield at that time that it is not necessary to postulate that the inclusion of cutlery dealing with the Beardshaws' other activities was brought about by a relationship with this maker of knife hafts.

The ledger has stock inventories dated 1825, 1827 and 1831, but it is the only surviving company document of that time, and there is nothing in it to show why the firm located where it did, and still less what reasons may have persuaded Beardshaw to start making saws. It is possible that he was moved to add sawmaking to victualling when his near neighbor Harrison died; leaving a saw works without an owner, but the six year interval seems long at a time when firms of all kinds were coming and going so fast. Publicans of all eras, and still more so before the days of mass communications, have been literally in a position - behind the bar - to pick up the news and gossip of a locality. The 19th century records are replete with the names of those who either had a shop or public house concurrently with running a secondary metal

manufacturing business, which is what Beardshaw did when he put the two together in 1823.

As for location, Hollis Croft contained at least three sawmaking firms in the years around 1820. According to the rate books, which unfortunately do not always give the ratepayer's house number, in 1818 John Kenyon was at number 6, Thomas Harrison at number 10a, and in 1821/2 Staniforth and Marshall were somewhere in the street. The first address of Beardshaws is number 5, Hollis Croft, but it is not possible, because numbering and its changes are so unclear, to say if this number is the same as any of the above three. By 1833 they were at number 18 Garden Street; this road is parallel to Hollis Croft, so that the premises possibly remained the same but became designated by the entrance at the back rather than the front. The directories show the business address changing to two other numbers in Garden street in 1837 and 1841, with a final change to numbers 16 and 18 in 1845, this last presumably indicating an increase in size. The firm remained there until 1854.

The next change, noted in the directory of 1856, and perhaps engendered partly because the premises in Garden Street were unsatisfactory, was to a completely different part of the town, two miles away in the rapidly developing east end (the old village of Attercliffe, on the way to Rotterdam), where all the new big steel firms were establishing themselves in the manufacture of Bessemer's steel. The way had been shown by Spear and Jackson, by then probably the largest Sheffield sawmakers, who had been the first to leave the old industrialized area round West Bar to take entirely fresh land next to the new railway line in 1841; other sawmakers and steelmakers established themselves in the same prime position in the 1840's.

In the standard manner, Jonathan Beardshaw and sons gave a name to their new premises in Effingham road: "Baltic Steel Works". Why they should have chosen this name is not known, but the choice may have been driven by the same sort of consideration that led other firms, in naming their works, to give an allusion to their most important markets. Two examples from later in the 19th century are Robert Sorby's Kangaroo Works and Taylor Brothers' Adelaide Works: both firms had large export markets in Australia. By the 1850's John Kenyon, and no doubt other firms whose catalogues are no longer extant and whose product lines can therefore not be known, were exporting very large quantities of saws to the Baltic and Russia, with some of their product types (large saws designed for tree felling) specifically named as Polish and Russian; Beardshaws' export patterns at this time are not known. The other significant feature of the naming is the word Steel Works rather than Saw Works, suggesting that they wished their production of the former to be seen as the more important.

In the following decades there were several changes. The 1862 directory shows the formation of a sawmaking company called Beardshaw, Stevenson and co, with premises at 32 Hollis Croft and also at nearby number 42 Carr lane (the latter having been occupied by two sawmaking firms with unrelated names in the previous 15 years). By 1864 Stevenson had gone, establishing himself some way away in Little Pond street, with Jonathan Beardshaw at Diamond Works, Hollis Croft (no number is given); both these firms disappear from the list of sawmakers by the time of the next directory, 1868. The Diamond Works address comes back in the sawmakers list in the 1876 directory, the owners being J and TS Beardshaw, but has gone by 1879. In 1884 a new Beardshaw - Herbert - is included for the first time, and at a new address: Acme Steel Works, Bessemer road, which was only a very short distance from the parent works in Effingham road. This listing is again in one directory only, but business of some sort was probably continued there, even if it did not include sawmaking, because by 1895 (until 1907) there is a firm called Joseph Beardshaw in Bessemer road. All this time what may be perhaps the main site of operations continued at the Baltic Steel Works, with the name Beardshaw making its last appearance in the list of sawmakers in 1971; by then, as a result of amalgamations and buyouts, it was called Beardshaw Senior Steels Ltd.

The purpose of this long list of changing premises is to show how fluid the sawmaking

industry was; other Sheffield secondary metal industries were probably little different. The reason for the changes lies partly in the nature of Sheffield industrial structures, partly, as has been suggested above, through the passage of time - premises become too small or in the wrong place - and partly because of external factors such as developing markets and new technologies.

The structure of Sheffield industry has been the subject of considerable academic study over many years; successive generations of Beardshaws were affected by all these, and were a pioneering firm, witness their move to the Attercliffe area in 1856 and their developments in steel technology in the early years of the 20th century.

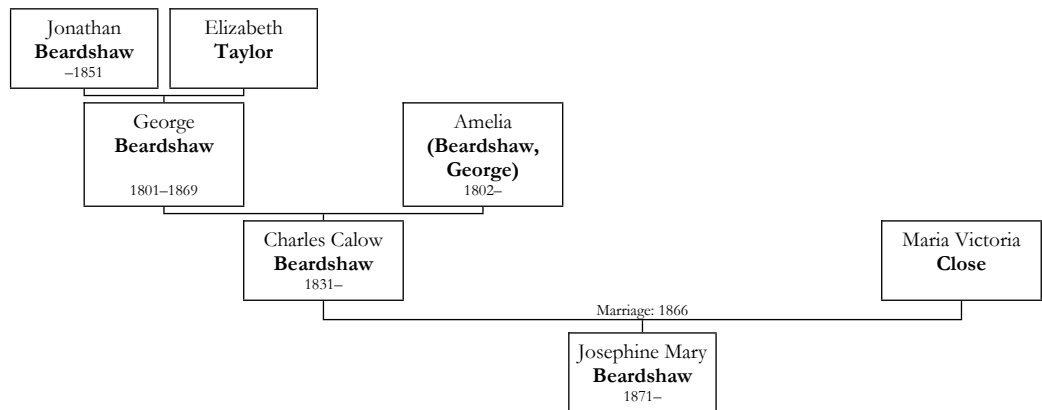

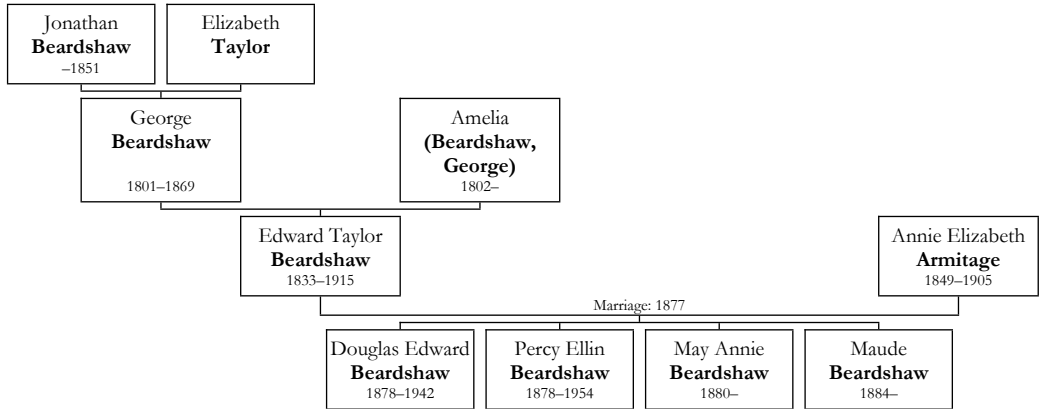

Sadly, Henry's children were not destined to be long lived. Margaret, Henrietta and Henry all died in their teens and in 1861 when their mother Maria died, only Morgan (25) and George (18) were left to carry on the family business. On Morgan's death in 1867 George inherited the entire estate which now amounted to not only the two properties on Wood Lane and the Mousehole Forge, but an extensive amount of local farmland with dwellings, Shooters Grove Farm and houses at Wisewood, Middlewood and West Bar. George had to pay a total of £237 17s 5d in Succession Duty. Shortly afterwards George married Annie Elizabeth. They started their married life living at Wood Lane House. At the time George described himself as "Farmer and Anvil Manufacturer. The couple moved to Woodville House in the early 1870's, and Wood Lane House was let to a Mr Mappin Wilson, manufacturer. In 1872, at only 32 years old, George died. He was the last of the property owning Armitage line. George and Annie

had not had children and therefore the whole of his estate passed to widow.

Annie, at only twenty-five, was left a very wealthy widow. The whole of Mousehole Forge was sold later that year to Mr William Cooper for £8,000. The production of anvils continued at the Forge until 1933. Annie continued to live at Woodville House until she remarried two or three years later. Edward Taylor Beardshaw was a well to do file and tool manufacturer. They moved back to Wood Lane House around 1880 and had at least 4 children - Douglas, Percy, May and Maud. The family also employed the services of a cook, a housemaid, a nurse, and when the children were older, a resident governess. In time Douglas joined the family business and moved to a house in Crescent Road, Sharrow. Edward Beardshaw died (or left) around the start of the First World War.

DEATH OF MR WALTER EMDEN

We regret to announce the death of Mr. Walter Emden which took place early yesterday morning at a nursing home in London following on an operation performed on Monday.

Mr. Emden, who was well-known in Sheffield and London, was 66 years of age. Early in life he studied mechanical engineering, and was subsequently ?????? ??????ring being engaged upon various important works in London. He then studied under two well-known architects and thus found his true vocation. He was the architect of several of London's best know buildings. Among the many theatres he designed was the Garrick, the Duke of York's, the Court, and Terry's: while he was also responsible for the Hotel de l'Europe in Leicester Square, The Piccadilly Hotel, and Prince's Restaurant.

Mr. Emden retired from practice in 1906. He was president of the Society of Architects for four years.

Latterly he had taken a prominent part in municipal affairs. In 1903 he was elected Mayor of the City of Westminster, while four years later he became Mayor of Dover, near which port he resided, and held that post for three successive years.

The late Mr. Emden was a frequent visitor to Sheffield, with which city he had close associations. His first wife was Annie Beardshaw, daughter of the late Mr. G. V. Beardshaw, of Messrs. J. Beardshaw and Sons, Baltic Steel Works, and sister of Mr. W. F. Beardshaw, the present head of the firm.

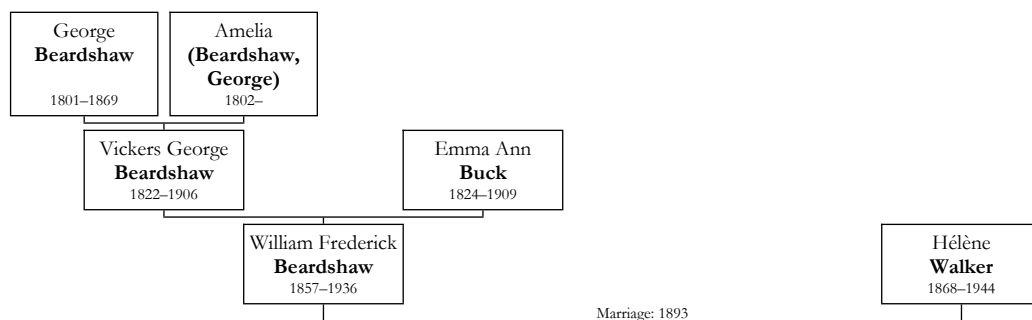
In conjunction with Mr. Edward Holmes, of Sheffield, Mr Emden designed the Lyceum Theatre, and with the late Mr. W. H. Lancashire he was responsible for the fine block of buildings occupied by Messrs. J. Marples and Co????? corner of Fitzallen Square.

NOTE from Tony Beardshaw: The bit about the Lyceum may not be right. WGR Sprague is claimed to be the designer. He was articted to Emden for 3 years in 1880 so this may be the reason for the misinformed newspaper article.

I wrote an article for Flowing Stream about the Zeppelin raids of 1916. It mentioned W F Beardshaw. It was also published in September 2016 in the Sheffield Star.

The article mentioned WF's business interests rather than his sporting achievements. There are many references in the local papers about his work, e.g. Sheffield Evening Telegraph 8 Sep 1893 re Chamber of Commerce, Sheffield Independent 8 April 1893 re dissolving of the partnership of Jonathan Beardshaw and Son.

However you may be interested in some of the sporting references I came across.

The Bridgroom was in his day a well-known Association Sheffield football player. Officiating clergyman was none other than the famous Cambridge-cum-Sheffield-cum-Surrey-cum-England forward, the

Rev. F W Pawson.

I've attached the Sheffield United programme article to this email.

It was a little puzzling at first as there is no record of WF's death in the UK BMD records. Also I cannot find any UK burial records for WF. The reason is that he actually died in France. Sheffield Independent 29 Feb 1936 has an obituary. WF lived at 1 Sandygate Park in Sheffield with his wife Helene. However he was in the habit of spending winter in the South of France. There may be a French connection as Helene, although a British subject, was born in Lille, France on 14 Feb 1868. WF became ill and died when staying at St. Aygulf Var, which is a seaside resort in Provence. He may be buried there or even cremated. I say cremated as you will see by reading on.

In 1939, Helene Beardshaw was living with a house keeper and a domestic at The Bungalow, Granville Road, Dover. In 1944, she died aged 76. She was cremated on 6th December 1944 at City Road Sheffield and so there wasn't a family grave.
